

The priest invites us to pray in silence, then says the prayer set for today,

God our redeemer,

you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant, that as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen**

First Reading: Acts 10.44-48

While Peter was speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

Gospel: John 15.9-17

We stand, facing the gospel.

Alleluia..., alleluia... I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore. Alleluia...

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Alleluia, Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

We sit for the **Sermon**, then we keep silence together.

The Liturgy of Baptism

Joshua, his parents and godparents come to the front. The congregation remains seated. The priest addresses the whole congregation,

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Joshua who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church.

Will you support him on his journey of faith? We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family? We will.

The priest then asks his parents and godparents,

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Parents and godparents, you speak for Joshua today.

Will you pray for him and help him to follow Christ? We will.

The priest addresses Joshua's parents and godparents. We all join in the responses:

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.** Do you reject evil? **I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I do.** Do you trust in him as Lord? **I do.**

The priest assures us of God's forgiveness.

Signing with the Cross

The priest makes the sign of the cross on Joshua's forehead, saying,

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

The ministers and baptism party go to the font, as we sing,

Behold, behold I make all things new, beginning with you and starting from today. Behold, behold I make all things new, my promise is true for I am Christ the way.

The Prayer over the Water

The congregation faces the font.

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ was baptized in the river Jordan, we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us. Saving God, **Give us life**.

We thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the Promised Land.
Saving God, **Give us life.**

We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son, and raised him to life in triumph.

Saving God, **Give us life.**

Bless this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin.

Saving God, Give us life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon them, bring them to new birth in the household of faith and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life; for all might, majesty, authority and power are yours, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Let us affirm, with all the baptized, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The priest baptizes Joshua saying

Joshua Isaiah Leman, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

After Joshua has been baptized, we sing,

♪ Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The priest leads us in prayer.

Father, by the victory of your Son, give light to the world.

We welcome Joshua

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: Joshua, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body. We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father, we welcome you.

The Peace

The priest takes the bread and wine and says the prayers of preparation: we respond to each part of the prayer: **Blessed be God forever.**

Please remain standing for the Eucharistic Prayer if it's comfortable for you.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here; God's Spirit is with us

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest praises God for his might acts, ending, ... we may find a voice to sing your praise:

→ Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

The priest continues, recalling the Last Supper, then the Deacon says,

Great is the mystery of faith:

♪ Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Prayer continues and at the end we sing,

♪ Amen, amen, amen.

As our Saviour taught, so we pray,

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen. The priest breaks the bread, saying,

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body,

because we all share in one bread.

The priest invites us to communion,

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

We share in Communion

The people receive communion. Those who do not wish to receive are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing. Gluten free wafers are available. Communion will be brought to those seated in the south aisle.

Please come to the front and form a queue. Communion will be offered in both kinds, on the hand and from the chalice (optional). Please do not intinct (dip) the wafer in the chalice.

Post-communion Prayer

Silence is kept. Then the priest says,

God our Father, whose Son Jesus Christ gives the water of eternal life: may we thirst for you, the spring of life and source of goodness, through him who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

Notices are given. We sing the final hymn. Joshua is given a lighted candle.
