


Parish Eucharist with Holy Baptism

Please join in all parts of the service printed in bold type. The \$\struct\$ sign indicates that this part is sung by everyone. Please stand where indicated only if you wish. When the bell rings, we stand to sing,

Welcome and introduction

Glory! Glory! Glory to God! Glory! Glory! Glory to God!

Glory to God in the heights of the heavens, peace to God's people, all people on earth.

Glory! Glory! Glory to God! ...

Son of the Father, all glory and worship; praise and thanksgiving to you, Lamb of God.

You take away the sin of the world; have mercy on us,

receive our prayer.

Seated in pow'r

at the right of the Father, Jesus alone is the Lord, the Most High.

The priest invites us to pray in silence, then says the prayer set for today,

Generous God,

you give us gifts and make them grow:

First Reading: Ephesians 1.3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people to the praise of his glory.

Gospel: Mark 6.14-29

We stand, facing the gospel.

♪ Alleluia..., alleluia... Strong is your love. Mighty your word. Speak to us now, open our hearts, alleluia...

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

King Herod heard of the healings and other miracles, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, 'John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.' But others said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.' But when Herod heard of it, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.'

For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it.' And he solemnly swore to her, 'Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom.' She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the Baptist.' Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptizer on a platter.' The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

We sit for the **Sermon**, then we keep silence together.

The Liturgy of Baptism

Sebastian, his parents and godparents come to the front. The congregation remains seated. The priest addresses the whole congregation,

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Sebastian who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church.

Will you support him on his journey of faith? We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family? We will.

The priest then asks his parents and godparents,

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Parents and godparents, you speak for Sebastian today.

Will you pray for him and help him to follow Christ? We will.

The priest addresses Sebastian's parents and godparents. We all respond.

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.** Do you reject evil? **I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I do.** Do you trust in him as Lord? **I do.**

The priest assures us of God's forgiveness.

Signing with the Cross

The priest makes the sign of the cross on Sebastian's forehead, saying,

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross. Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

The ministers and baptism party go to the font, as we sing,

Water of life, cleanse and refresh us; raise us to life in Christ Jesus.

All you who thirst, come to the waters, and you will never be thirsty again.

As rain from heaven, so is God's word, it waters the earth and brings forth life.

The Prayer over the Water

The congregation faces the font.

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus.

He was baptized in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love.

He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. Amen.

Let us affirm, with all the baptized, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The priest baptizes Sebastian saying

Sebastian Arthur, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

After Sebastian has been baptized, we sing,

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The priest leads us in prayer.

We welcome Sebastian

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: Sebastian, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body. We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father, we welcome you.

The Peace

We are all one in Christ Jesus. We belong to him through faith, heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

The deacon says: Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We exchange a sign of peace and return to our places as we sing. The plate and card reader is available for contactless and cash donations.

From heaven you came, helpless babe, entered our world, your glory veiled; not to be served, but to serve, and give your life that we might live.

This is our God, the Servant King, he calls us now to follow him, to bring our lives as a daily offering of worship to the Servant King.

Come see his hands and his feet, the scars that speak of sacrifice, hands that flung stars into space to cruel nails surrendered. There in the garden of tears, my heavy load he chose to bear; his heart with sorrow was torn, "Yet not my will but yours," he said

The priest continues, recalling the Last Supper, then the deacon says,

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Prayer continues and at the end we sing, Amen, amen. Amen, amen.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.
